Freedom of Information Foundation of Texas update: During the 2019 legislative session, open government advocates hope they can convince lawmakers to demolish the legal barriers created by court decisions that restrict access to important public information. Among other things, these decisions prevent knowing how taxpayers' money is being spent. Details. Related: Rep. Todd Hunter, R-Corpus Christi, has filed two major bills in the FOI Foundation/Texas Sunshine Coalition open government legislative agenda. House Bill 1655 would restore public access to dates of birth in many public documents, including criminal justice records and candidate applications. House Bill 1700 closes the "custodian loophole" in the Texas Public Information Act and would make it easer to obtain public records contained in officials' private devices or e-mail accounts. <u>Details.</u> ... <u>Corpus</u> Christi Caller-Times: What are SLAPP lawsuits and why do you need a law to protect you from them? ... Commentary: Transparency, economic development regulations are dying in Texas. ... The League of United Latin American Citizens filed a lawsuit Jan. 29 against Texas Secretary of State David Whitley and Attorney General Ken Paxton, seeking to force state officials to release the data used in support of Paxton's claim that nearly 100,000 voters may not be U.S. citizens. The suit calls Paxton's announcement a method of voter suppression, meant to instill fear in Hispanic voters. "That's all they're doing," said Luis Vera, LULAC's general counsel. "They've done it in Florida; they've done it in Arizona and other states. It's voter intimidation, voter threats." Details.

OVER & OUT | John Dycus, Fort Worth SPJ

The lead headline in this issue should make your heart beat like an ax handle on a wash tub. It stirs the imagination that the Fort Worth Press has been reborn as a nonprofit. Old name, cutting-edge funding model. It works for The Texas Tribune and appears to be working for Oklahoma Watch and Truthout and the more than 180 nonprofit U.S. newsrooms that are members of the Institute for Nonprofit News, which, by the way, the INN estimates have a staff of about 3,000 — including nearly 2,200 journalists — and combined annual revenue approaching \$350 million. Follow along at fortworthpress.org. We keep seeing light at the end of a tunnel. Maybe this time it isn't a train.

SPJ Factoids: According to the 2018 Kopenhaver Center Report, women earn less and experience negative company cultures in the communications industry. The report also found that many middle-managing and junior-level positions are held by women. ... While the U.S. has the privilege of free press, other countries continue to struggle with media suppression. Under a new administration in Uzbekistan, all journalists imprisoned by the previous administration have been released. ... Covering a shooting is made even more difficult when it's close to home. To further complicate things, hatemongers are free to spread their beliefs on social media. What's a journalist to do? ... With help from journalism students, a Miami man was freed after 12 years behind bars for murder. Tony Brown's freedom came thanks to students from the Medill Justice Project at Northwestern University, who interviewed a prison inmate who admitted Brown was not the killer. ... Damian Radcliffe shares his "Lessons learned: seven ways news outlets can rebuild trust and sustainability."

Caught my eye. NRC recklessly disregards critical lessons of Fukushima. ... Climate change is killing reindeer in the Arctic. ... Texas has enough sun and wind to guit coal, Rice researchers say. ... Vulnerable nuclear waste stockpiles becoming global crisis.






