



### Finances a concern, but SPJ president optimistic

SPJ national president **Ashanti Blaize-Hopkins** told close to 30 Texas SPJ members, including San Antonio Chapter president Michael Drudge and Houston president Ruth Nasrullah, in October that she has high hopes for SPJ's future while acknowledging issues with finances.

SPJ's national board voted Sept. 27 at the national convention to cancel the 2024 convention. The reason? Money. Blaize-Hopkins, then the presidentelect, made the motion to cancel; she said it would be irresponsible to have the convention when there isn't enough money to pay for it. SPJ national is currently undergoing an audit for the 2023 fiscal year.

Blaize-Hopkins, a tenured journalism professor at Santa Monica College, was sworn in Oct. 1. The first Black woman to be elected SPJ president, she said she has been working ever since. "I'm one of those people who likes to hit the ground running," she said. "So I was taking meetings Sunday right after convention."

In the Zoom meeting she partially addressed the four-year financial initiative that SPJ Foundation board member **Frank LoMonte** presented during the convention. She said she could not give any specifics because she simply didn't have them yet. SPJ also has hired nonprofit fundraiser **Lucas Metropulos** and intensified its search for an executive director, perhaps a recent;y retired journalism dean or someone who has run journalism nonprofits. "This is going to be a passion project for them," she said, "and I think we already have a short list of folks we can reach out to."

Fort Worth SPJ president **Eddye Gallagher**, who has served on the national finance committee, said that during her term the committee did not meet and she never was told where the money was or where it went. "We were suggesting where it should go, which was in a fund to raise money and not be spent on anything, and I still want an answer to that."

Blaize-Hopkins said 2021-22 president **Rebecca Aguilar** had requested an investment account be made and \$500,000 would go into it as a nest egg, but none of that happened. "It was put into the general operation fund," she said. "By the time I took over as vice president and ended up a member of the finance committee ... \$131,000 of that money (was) all that was left."

Blaize-Hopkins is forming three task forces to probe the sustainability of local and ethnic media, research the effects of generative artificial intelligence (AI) on journalism, and address journalists' mental health. One meeting participant, Robert Buckman, an SPJ member for over 50 years, encouraged her to talk to some older SPJ members and hear their opinions.

"I don't want to outlive SPJ, and I'm counting on you to do your part this year to try to keep it solvent," he said. "But encourage participation on some of these task forces from members of other regions besides some of the big chapters who tend to control things. A lot of good people are out there with a lot of good ideas."


